### Course Levels





#### What is the Difference between the levels?

- <u>Core Math</u>- 6<sup>th</sup> grade content aligned to 6<sup>th</sup> grade standards, smaller class sizes
- Advanced Math- skips ½ of the 6<sup>th</sup> grade content, covers the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of 6th grade content and ½ pre-algebra (7<sup>th</sup> grade content)
- ► Pre-Algebra skips all of the 6<sup>th</sup> grade content, pre-Algebra content
- ► Core ELA- 6<sup>th</sup> grade content aligned to 6<sup>th</sup> grade standards, smaller class sizes
- Advanced ELA- 6<sup>th</sup> grade content at accelerated pace, novels at 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade reading level
- ► <u>Accelerated ELA</u>- 6<sup>th</sup> grade content at accelerated pace, expectations for additional independent writing, novels at 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade reading level

All students take ELA Benchmark Assessment

The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Student is ready for 6<sup>th</sup> Grade ELA, but does not meet criteria for Advanced Core or Accelerated ELA. Reading and Writing skills are nearing or at grade level on ELA Benchmark.

The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade student meets the following criteria: Reading is at least one grade level above and score of "Proficient" on ELA Benchmark; 80% on Renzulli-Hartman Checklist & recommendation (completed by teacher)

The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade student meets the following criteria: Reading and one grade level above and "exceeds proficiency" on ELA Benchmark, and Renzulli-Hartman Checklist score of 90% & recommendation (completed by teacher)


All 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will take Math Placement



The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade student meets the following criteria: 90% on Math Placement Test/Exceeds Expectations, and Renzulli-Hartman Checklist score of 90% & recommendation (completed by teacher), 85% on pre-algebra assessment (part 3)





6<sup>th</sup> Grade CORE MATH

# High School Course Implications

### General FAQ

- When will be notified of placements?
   Placements will be available to families via Genesis by June 30.
- 2. Will we receive the results of the placement test or Renzulli Checklist? You will receive the scores for each element of the placement process via Genesis
- 3. What if my child is recommended for Pre-Algebra, but we want him or her to take the Advanced Core?

Please contact either Mr. Englishmen or Dr. Cullis right away. The scheduling process starts after school ends and is completed by the end of July. It is more difficult to make changes after that time.

### Selecting Cycle Courses

- Students will take 4 quarterly cycle classes
- 1 quarter Health
- 1 quarter STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math)
- 2 Choice electives (Art, Music, Computers, Family & Consumer Science)
  - Students will rank their elective choices in June
  - Top choice elective not guaranteed, we will try to honor 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> choices

### **Additional Course Information**

- Students will take 1 semester of French and 1 semester of Spanish.
- Band lessons will take place during the regular school day on a rotating basis, the whole band meets after school.
- Chorus meets after school.
- Strings Ensemble meets before school.
- Band and Chorus are listed on the report card as 10<sup>th</sup> period and are graded with a "P". All students enrolled in band and chorus receive a "P".
- Students in ExPO do not take additional electives or STEM
