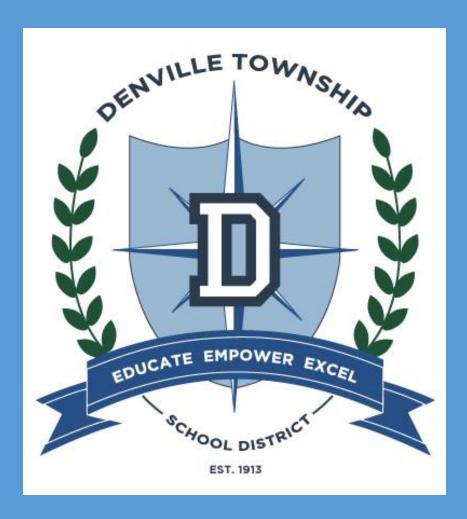
# Denville Public Schools Town Council Presentation October 3, 2017





### **Accomplishments Since 2014**

- 1. New complete roof at RV- new sections at LV and VV (\$2.4M)
- 2. Site work at all schools (\$500K)
- 3. Bathroom replacement at all schools (\$700K)
- 4. ESIP program- new controls, HVAC, lighting, insulation (\$1.9M)
- 5. Renovations and Reconfiguring of Libraries maximize instructional space (\$600K)
- 6. Funding for free lunches for disadvantaged children (\$70K)
- 7. Funding for Homework Help at Peer Place after school hours (\$40K)
- 8. Network and Wi-Fi upgrades (\$600K)

Total spent on these projects: \$6.81M

All projects completed with grants and/or operating budgets- no referendum needed at this point. The last of the debt from the 2000 project at LV will expire in 2019.



#### Denville 2022 Strategic Plan Created with 100+ stakeholders

- Goal: To develop a culture of learning that enables students to excel in the 21st century global community.
- Goal: Provide a rich learning environment based in the New Jersey standards that will challenge students at all levels with standardized system to measure growth.
- Goal: Create an environment that fosters self-aware, resilient, civically-minded and empathetic citizens.
- Goal: To create a safe and secure learning environment equipped to deliver 21st century educational expectations, using efficient and sustainable facilities districtwide.



## Facilities Challenges/History

- 1. Substandard Instructional Temporary Space- Trailers- in use since 2006
- 2. Dual Use Space- using rooms for a purpose other than the intended purpose (libraries/closets for classrooms, rooms split with ¾ walls)
- 3. Four- K and PK classes without bathrooms per NJAC 6A:26-6.3(H)- classes added without proper space

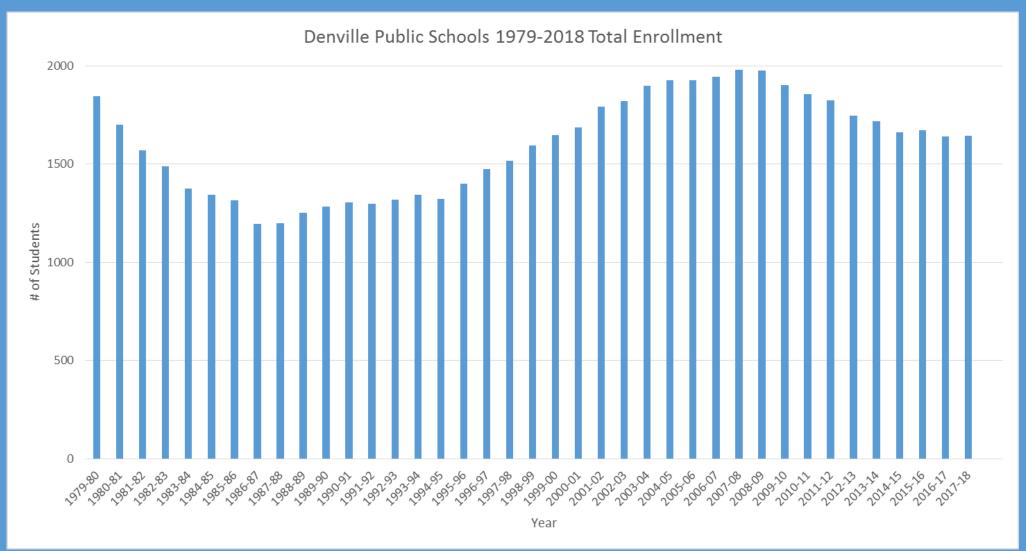

### **Facts**

Enrollment has gone down but is now leveling off

- The addition of FTK added the need for 4 classrooms with bathrooms.
  - 80% of NJ school districts have FTK.
  - Prior to FTK in Denville less than 20% of our K 5's read on grade level when entering grade 1 now that number is 90%
- The PK program has grown from 1 class to 4 classes (mandated program)
- Other new special education programs have been added
- The district is planning to complete the third library renovation/reconfiguration to maximize our space without using substandard space for children.
  - This was decided as the best option at this point rather than a \$10M referendum for additional space at RV
- There is no more space in our current building envelope.
- Per Pupil- Cost for 2017-18 = \$17,149
